## PIMCO Dynamic Income Opportunities Fund (PDO)

The fund utilizes an opportunistic approach to pursue high conviction income-generating ideas across both traditional and alternative credit markets to seek current income as a primary objective and capital appreciation as a secondary objective.

- In managing the fund, PIMCO employs a dynamic asset allocation strategy across multiple fixed income sectors based on, among other things, market conditions, valuation assessments, economic outlook, credit market trends and other economic factors. With PIMCO's macroeconomic analysis as the basis for top-down investment decisions, including geographic and credit sector emphasis, PIMCO manages the fund with a focus on seeking income generating investment ideas across multiple fixed income sectors, with an emphasis on seeking opportunities in developed and emerging global credit markets.
- The fund will normally invest at least 25% of its total assets in mortgage-related assets issued by government agencies or other governmental entities or by private originators or issuers. The fund may invest up to 30% of its total assets in securities and instruments that are economically tied to "emerging market" countries; however, the fund may invest without limitation in short-term investment grade sovereign debt issued by emerging market issuers. The fund may normally invest up to 40% of its total assets in bank loans. It is expected that the fund normally will have a short to intermediate average portfolio duration (i.e., within a zero to eight year range).

The firm's innovative investment process is designed to add value for clients by marrying a top-down, global macroeconomic outlook with bottom-up analysis from one of the industry's most experienced research teams.
