

# PIMCO All Asset Fund

#### Differentiated asset allocation approach targeting strong after-inflation returns

With a focus on out of mainstream asset classes and a value-oriented, contrarian process, the fund seeks maximum real return while also potentially helping improve diversification and adding an explicit inflation buffer.

The **Sharpe Ratio** measures the risk-adjusted performance. The risk-free rate is subtracted from the rate of return for a portfolio and the result is divided by the standard deviation of the risk-free rate subtracted from the portfolio returns. **Volatility** is measured by the standard deviation, or dispersion of a set of data from its mean, based on historical portfolio returns. A larger spread of data indicates higher standard deviation and higher volatility. **Effective maturity** is a weighted average of all the maturities of the bonds in a portfolio, computed by weighting each bonds effective maturity by the market value of the security.
