**Fund description**

The Broad U.S. TIPS Index Exchange-Traded Fund is an exchange-traded fund (ETF) that aims to capture the returns of The ICE BofAML US Inflation-Linked Treasury Index. By tracking the index, the fund aims to achieve, before fees and expenses, the real return (above inflation) and the diversification benefits inherent in this index.

**Investor benefits**

Potential benefits of this fund include:

- Inflation protection - TIPS provide a return that is linked to the monthly change in inflation, as measured by the CPI (consumer price index).
- Real yield - The underlying securities provide return potential that may exceed inflation, which is known as real yield.
- Low default risk - TIPS are backed by the full faith and credit of the U.S. government as to the timely payment of interest and principal. (However, the portfolio is not guaranteed and will fluctuate in value).
- Diversification - TIPS will provide diversification relative to U.S. Treasuries and other investments that may underperform when inflation is high or rising.
- The ETF structure allows for trading throughout the day and has the same expense ratio for all investors, regardless of size. Fund shares are publicly traded, offering accessibility to any investor who can access a major stock exchange.

**The fund advantage**

As a market leader and innovator in TIPS investing, PIMCO recognizes that investors may benefit from owning securities throughout the TIPS maturity spectrum. This recognition is a by-product of PIMCO's expertise in TIPS management, a practice which began at the inception of the TIPS market in 1997 and today is one of the largest in the world. This fund seeks to avail investors of the potential benefits of investing in the broad TIPS market, including the inflation-hedging and diversification characteristics that are unique to these securities.

**Exchange Traded Funds ("ETF")** are afforded certain exemptions from the Investment Company Act. The exemptions allow, among other things, for individual shares to trade on the secondary market. Purchases and redemptions directly with ETFs are only accomplished through creation unit aggregations or "baskets" of shares. Shares of an ETF, traded on the secondary market, are bought and sold at market price (not NAV). Brokerage commissions will reduce returns. **Buying or selling ETF shares** on an exchange may require the payment of fees, such as brokerage commissions, and other fees to financial intermediaries. Net Asset Value (NAV) represents an ETF's per-share value. The per-share value of an ETF is calculated by dividing the total value of the securities in its portfolio, less any liabilities, by the number of ETF shares outstanding. ETF shares are valued as of the close of regular trading on the NYSE Arca (normally 4:00 P.M. Eastern Time) (The "NYSE Close") on each business day.

The Fund's Net Asset Value, shares outstanding and total net assets are calculated as of the close of regular trading on each day that the NYSE Arca is open, and do not reflect security transactions or Fund shares created or redeemed on the date stated. Such transactions are recorded on the next business day and reported on the website the following business day.

Returns are average annualized total returns, except for those periods of less than one year, which are cumulative. Market returns are based upon the midpoint of the bid/ask spread at 4:00 pm Eastern time (when NAV is normally determined for most ETFs), and do not represent the returns you would receive if you traded shares at other times.

The per share NAV of an ETF is calculated at the end of each business day, and fluctuates with changes in the market value of the Fund's holdings. The trading prices of an ETF's shares fluctuate continuously throughout the trading day based on market supply and demand, which may not correlate to NAV. The trading prices of an ETF's shares may differ significantly from NAV during periods of market volatility, which may, among other factors, lead to the Fund's shares trading at a premium or discount to NAV.
