Under the Expense Limit, which renews annually for a full year unless terminated by PIMCO upon at least 30 days' notice prior to the end of the contract term, PIMCO may recoup these waivers and reimbursements in future periods under certain conditions.

Fund description

The PIMCO Municipal Income Opportunities Active Exchange-Traded Fund (Ticker: MINO) is an actively managed ETF designed for investors seeking tax-exempt income from federal income tax and long-term capital appreciation. MINO is an intermediate term "core-plus municipal bond strategy"¹, designed to provide tax-sensitive investors with exposure across the municipal credit spectrum, from investment grade to high yield.

With the ability to invest up to 30% in sub-investment grade municipal debt, the Fund provides portfolio managers the flexibility to actively navigate the full breadth of the municipal bond market. By actively seeking alpha opportunities in the investment grade and high yield space, MINO seeks higher tax-advantaged income and return potential than typical passive Investment Grade-only ETFs that dominate the marketplace for a tactical increase in risk.

Investor benefits

MINO brings the benefits of PIMCO's broader municipal bond expertise, size and experience in an ETF vehicle.

Potential benefits of this fund include:

- The ETF structure allows for trading throughout the day and has the same expense ratio for all investors, regardless of size. Fund shares are publicly traded, offering accessibility to any investor who can access a major stock exchange. Additionally, ETFs offer increased transparency by disclosing underlying holdings in the portfolio on a daily basis.

The fund advantage

We believe that the fragmented and retail-dominated municipal market – which comprises over 50,000 issuers and 1 million CUSIPs – provides an attractive opportunity set for active management. Leveraging our top-down macro views, our team of dedicated portfolio managers, municipal credit research analysts, and quantitative analysts seek to find attractive value on a bottom-basis. The Fund attempts to take advantage of municipal market inefficiencies by broadening the opportunity set beyond that of a broad municipal bond index. Through active management, the Fund can actively manage portfolio liquidity, seek to capitalize on small non-index eligible issuances and private active bonds, tactically overweight credit segments and sectors, and identify mispriced callable bonds through analytics.

ETF shares are valued as of the close of regular trading on the NYSE Arca (normally 4:00 P.M. Eastern Time) (The "NYSE Close") on each business day.

The Fund's Net Asset Value, shares outstanding and total net assets are calculated as of the close of regular trading on each day that the NYSE Arca is open, and do not reflect security transactions or Fund shares created or redeemed on the date stated. Such transactions are recorded on the next business day and reported on the website the following business day.

Returns are average annualized total returns, except for those periods of less than one year, which are cumulative.
