Performance summary

The PIMCO Enhanced Short Maturity Active ESG Exchange-Traded Fund returned -0.33% (NAV returns) in June versus the FTSE 3-Month Treasury Bill Index, which returned 0.07% for the month. Year-to-date the Fund has returned -1.41% (NAV returns), while the benchmark returned 0.17%.

Explanation of portfolio characteristics

- The fund is modestly overweight headline duration versus the benchmark in its overall positioning. We remain active with our interest rate exposure as global yield curves respond to monetary tightening.
- We are focusing on security selection with a bias toward high quality, liquid names, and avoiding sectors with structural challenges from an Environmental, Social, and Governance perspective. We continue to hold short dated corporate bonds, securitized credit and agency bonds. We prefer high quality, short dated asset backed securities compared to generic corporate credit to add an alternative source of spread.
- We continuously seek to identify attractively priced green bonds¹ to address climate change issues and support leading environmental practices.

Market commentary

The Enhanced Short Maturity Active ESG ETF's NAV underperformed relative to its benchmark in Q2'22 as the Fund's spread and duration strategies detracted from performance.

The fundamental backdrop showed signs of a slowdown amid weakening economic data releases, while inflation remained elevated. Central banks adopted more hawkish stances in response to persistent inflation. The Fed delivered a 75bps hike (the first since 1994) and shifted expectations forward, while the BoE and BoC also raised their policy rates. Performance was challenged for both "safe-haven" and risk assets as global yields rose meaningfully and risk sentiment waned. Equities broadly ended lower – with some markets dipping into bear territories – while credit and EM external spreads widened.

We will continue to manage the strategy for investors who seek capital preservation and liquidity, while aiming to provide attractive returns above traditional cash investments for a modest increase in risk. We aim to position the portfolio for resiliency as economic fundamentals evolve and central banks continue to tighten monetary policy. We are emphasizing opportunities that we expect to offer ample liquidity, compelling yields, and capital preservation.

[1]EMNT will primarily invest in short duration investment grade debt securities, and will disclose all portfolio holdings on a daily basis. The average portfolio duration of EMNT will vary based on PIMCO s economic forecasts and active investment process decisions, and will not normally exceed one year. [1] The Fund considers ESG factors to choose securities that comprise the fund and to proactively engage with issuers to real ize ESG-objectives. Environmental ("E") factors can include matters such as climate change, pollution, waste, and how an issuer prote cts and/or conserves natural resources. Social ("S") factors can include how an issuer manages its relationships with individuals, such as its employees, shareholders, customers and its community. Governance ("G") factors can include how an issuer operates, such as its leadership, pay and incentive structures, internal controls, and the rights of equity and debt holders.

Premiums or discounts are the differences (expressed as a percentage) between the NAV and the Market Price of the Fund on a given day, generally at the time the NAV is calculated. A premium is the amount that the Fund is trading above the reported NAV, expressed as a percentage of the NAV. A discount is the amount that the Fund is trading below the reported NAV, expressed as a percentage of the NAV. A discount or premium could be significant. The daily premium/discount is the difference between the daily market price for s hares of the Fund and the Fund's net asset value. For purposes of the premium/discount information, market price is determined using NYSE Arca's Official Closing Price or if it more accurately reflects market price at the time as of which NAV is calculated, the midpoint between the national best bid and national best offer as of that time. Market price for purposes of other information is calculated as fo llows: (i) for time periods preceding December 17, 2020, the midpoint between the highest bid and the lowest offer on the listing exchange, as of the time that the Fund's NAV is calculated and (ii) for the time periods starting December 17, 2020, the NYSE Arca's Official Closing Price or, if it more accurately reflects market price at the time as of which NAV is calculated, the midpoint between the national best bid and national best offer as of that time. Market Price is the Official Closing Price on NYSE Arca, or if it more accurately reflects market value at the time as of which NAV is calculated, the midpoint between the national best bid and national best offer as of that time. Median Bid/Ask spread is difference between the bid price for a security and its ask price. It is expressed as a percentage (rounded to the neares t hundredth) that is computed by identifying the fund's national best bid and national best offer as of the end of each 10 -second interval during each trading day for the last 30 calendar days, dividing the difference between each such bid and offer by the midpoint of the national be st bid and national best offer, and identifying the median of those values.
